At College Bound, we commit to our students for seven to nine years, every step of the way: mastering Algebra II, coping with lifecycle events like grief, college financial literacy, first internships, first suits, first jobs.

When a high school junior overcomes his test anxiety and increases his ACT score by two points, we celebrate.

When a college freshman faces unconscious racism on her majority-white and majority-privileged campus, we are by her side.

WHAT'S (inside) OUR PROGRAMS

College Bound's **TO & THROUGH** program prepares the “whole child” for success in college and life. Throughout high school and college (seven to nine years), students gain academic competencies, social and emotional skills, college application navigation and a strong community service ethic. This strong and long approach creates learners with a mindset to grow, persist towards goals, contribute to the workforce and give back to the community.

In 2013-2014, we served 283 high school students and 306 collegians.

HIGH SCHOOL

Begins summer after 9th grade. Weekly classes include:

- College knowledge & financial literacy
- Social-emotional curriculum
- Building academic mindsets
- Creating community
- Career readiness practice
- ACT prep from an external contractor

Outside of class, students participate in:

- Social-emotional development
- Career panels
- Job shadowing
- Community service
- Cultural field trips
- College visits and fairs
- Home visits
- Intensive summer programming
- Mental health services

COLLEGE

Begins in the second semester of 12th grade and goes through college graduation.

College coaches:

- Provide 1:1 case management with a 30:1 ratio
- Monitor milestones and indicators of success
- Track progress in persistence database
- Focus on grades, finances and mental health

Beyond coaching, CB provides collegians with:

- College readiness programming
- Career readiness boot-camps
- Networking sessions
- Care packages
- Financial aid counseling
- Community service opportunities
- Social team bonding events

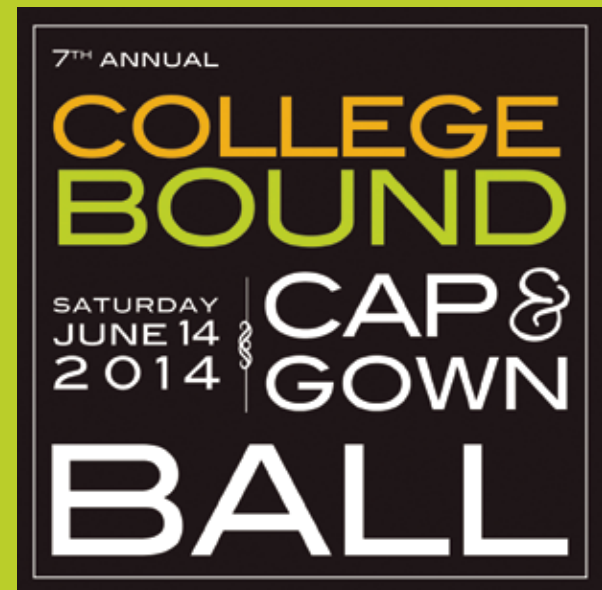

At CB we have a Young Men's group. Male students meet to explore life-transforming topics: how to be peer leaders, how to face adversity and understanding masculinity. Students confide in positive male role models and find a safe place to speak up.

Our students know they are loved and supported when they leave home for college. How? **We send three care packages throughout the year filled with goodies** like chicken ramen, highlighters, chapstick, hot chocolate, aspirin and, best of all, hand-written, encouraging notes from their CB family.

CB students gain a strong community ethic by volunteering at organizations such as: Habitat for Humanity, Food Outreach, Gateway 180, and St. Louis Crisis Nursery. Being able to give outside of oneself boosts confidence and says, "I can make a difference."

What happens when a CB student cannot afford transportation to get to campus for her first day of college? **We rent a mini van, help her pack, and drive her there.** Saying goodbye to family and coaches (usually from the CB parking lot) is full of proud, joyful tears.

On the morning of the ACT, we gather in the parking lot of the test site to make sure our high school juniors are at their best. We provide breakfast, calculators and sharpened #2 pencils. The only thing they have to focus on is bringing home their highest score yet.

How does a CB teen girl feel smart, safe and infinitely worthy? We talk about it weekly. **Our G.R.O.W. (Girls. Real. Open. Wise.) group is a safe place for teenage girls to openly share,** unconditionally belong and fiercely support one another to live fully.



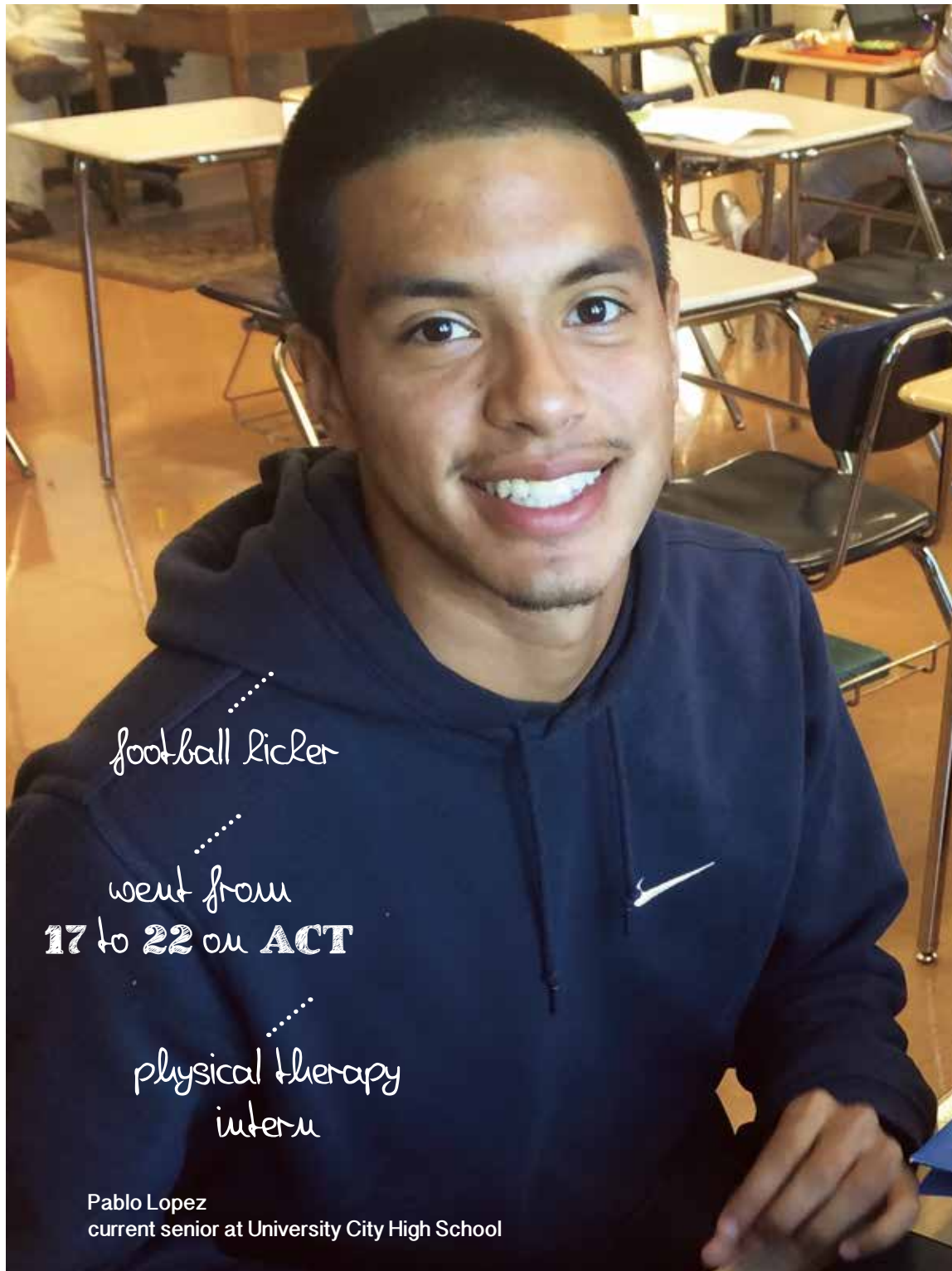

WHAT'S (inside) OUR IMPACT

Since 2006:

100% of CB students have graduated from high school.

94% of CB students have matriculated to college within six months of high school graduation.

88% of CB collegians persisted from 1st to 2nd year, 82% persisted from 2nd to 3rd year, and 76% persisted from 3rd to 4th year.

CB collegians are graduating at **5 TIMES** the rate of their low-income, first-generation peers, and at the same rate of students with family incomes of \$100,000+.



BRIDGIT2COLLEGE

In 2013, College Bound created Bridgit, an online, mobile-optimized software that bridges the gap between college acceptance and attendance.

Up to 40% of low-income, college-intending students fail to matriculate. This compares to 20% of students among all income groups nationally.¹

Bridgit makes data actionable for high school counselors and includes features such as: texting, in-system messaging, a resource library, communication logs and 24/7 connectivity.

- **Since 2014, Bridgit has served more than 3,500 students in five states**
- **Bridgit earned the Global OutSystems Innovation award of 2014**

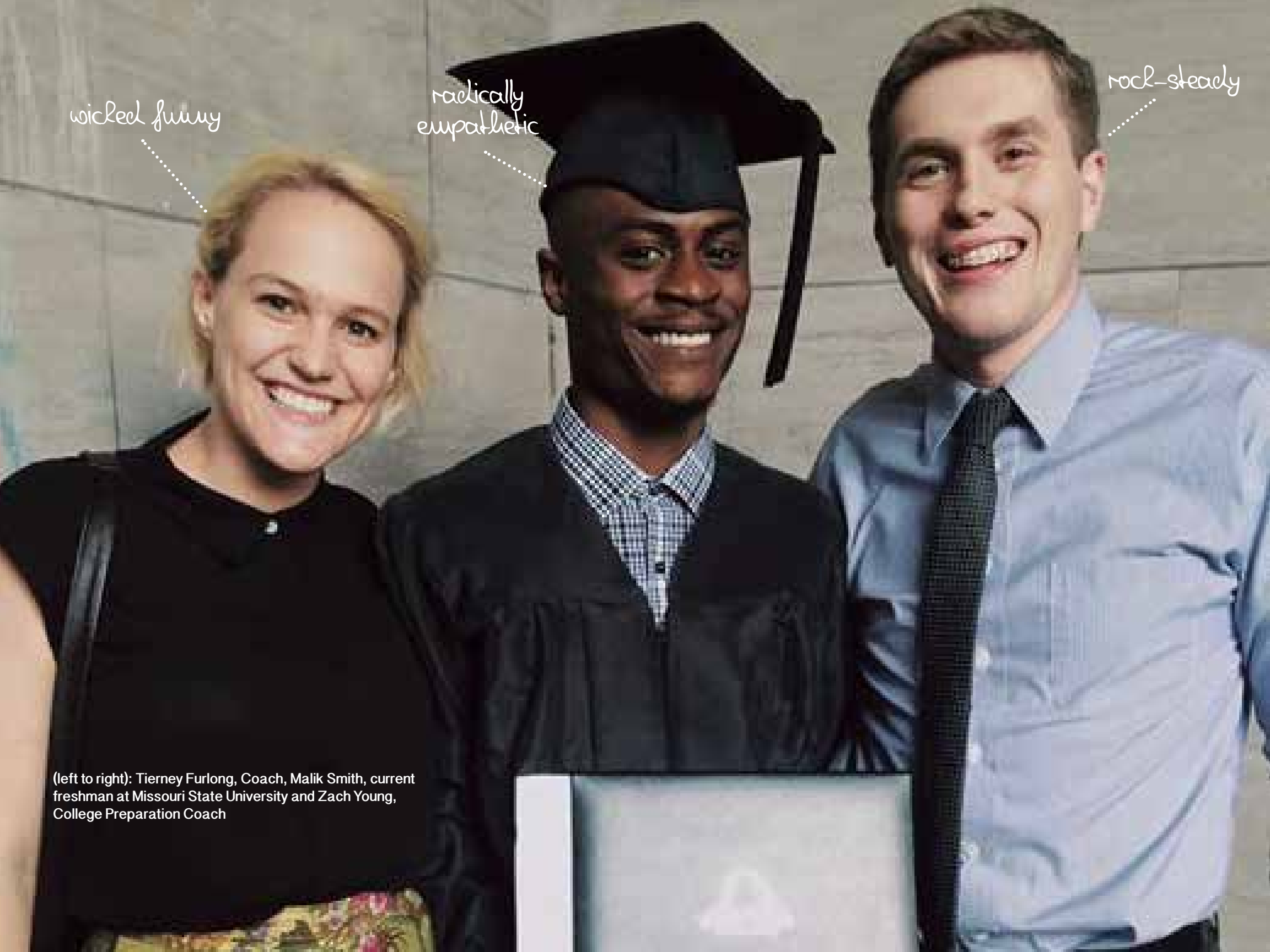

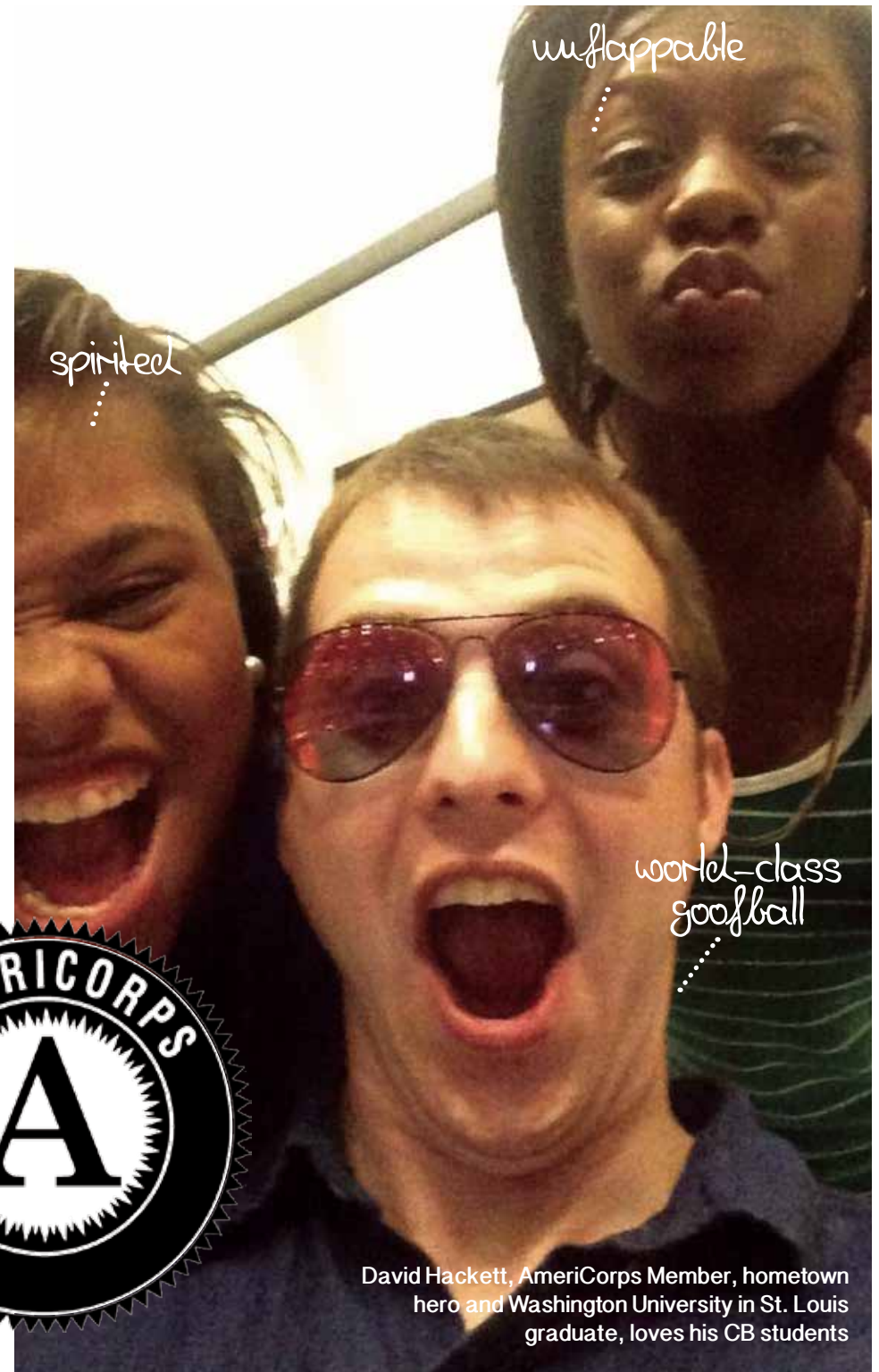
Each year, CB recruits a diverse group of AmeriCorps coaches. All coaches bring a record of achievement and they commit to up to three years of service to equity in education.

In 2014, our coaches served, taught, mentored and moved toward a better outcome for 589 College Bound students through 45,000 hours of service valued at more than \$900,000--all in exchange for a modest living stipend.

While we live by our data, we cannot quantify our coaches' depth of commitment to build relationships with our students.

David Hackett served as an AmeriCorps coach at CB for three years. Now, he is full-time staff managing a team of coaches. He shared this: "CB has taught me compassion and to love watching my students grow. They've changed so much over the years and make me incredibly proud. I wouldn't trade the relationships I've been afforded with my students for the world."
