

Because when we carry joy alongside determination, our chances of success for our students and our region multiply.

For that, we are deeply grateful. Together, we will keep playing forward, measure after measure, because we persist—**and we always will.**

CB students will navigate barriers to higher education attainment and enter successful careers and live fulfilling lives of choice and opportunity.

North Star Goals

65% of CB students in To & Through will complete higher education with a bachelor's degree within six years of high school graduation.



Much More Than Academics

At College Bound, foundational supports go beyond academics. We know that students can't focus on the future if their basic needs aren't being met. This includes **emergency student funding**, **tuition support**, **access to food and personal care items** — basic needs that are often overlooked but make a meaningful difference in a student's ability to focus and thrive.

Integrated **mental health services** ensure students have access to licensed therapists, **social-emotional learning** opportunities, and **crisis response** when needed. Our student stabilization efforts help address housing insecurity, financial emergencies, and personal or family challenges, removing the kinds of obstacles that too often derail college dreams.





We have transitioned to a fully professional staffing model from one that relied heavily on short-term commitments of AmeriCorps members. This shift has provided more stability and positively impacted student outcomes.

What We Do

We walk alongside our students through high school, college, and into their early careers. That kind of sustained relationship is rare, and it's the core of the CB difference.

Each grade-level team includes an academic specialist to support learning, a stabilization specialist for basic needs and case management support, and a possibility specialist who focuses on career exploration and aptitudes.

Our students receive consistent, personalized support from coaches who know them well through every milestone and setback. For nearly a decade, we help them navigate college applications, financial aid, academic challenges, mental health concerns, and career planning. This unwavering presence builds trust, stability, and confidence, especially for young people who too often face systems that aren't built with them in mind.

TO & THROUGH is our flagship 7-9 year program that begins in 10th grade and ends with college graduation. This commitment is the core of the CB difference.

College Preparation: (10th- 12th grade)

- Develop good study habits and sharpen academic tools
- Receive individualized ACT prep
- Visit colleges of interest
- Attend career exploration events
- Apply for best-fit colleges with the support of an individual coach
- Receive personalized guidance for financial aid and scholarship opportunities

College Completion: (one-on-one assistance through college)

- Debt management
- Course selection
- Career planning
- Networking opportunities

CB ON CAMPUS recognizes that a traditional four-year college path is not the only road to success. CB on Campus opens doors by embedding our team on the campuses of St. Louis Community College-Forest Park and Ranken Technical College.

CB provides timely financial support, whether for tuition shortfalls, textbooks, or emergency expenses, to ensure financial barriers don't derail college success.

TO & THROUGH **PROGRAM**





Relationships start as early as 9th grade with our recruitment team presenting at schools and spreading the word about our program. The Class of 2027 attend 24 different high schools in the region.

Meet Paige, a recent CB graduate.

Paige joined College Bound in 2018, as a sophomore at the Collegiate School of Medicine & Bioscience. She followed in the footsteps of her older sister, Averey (CB Class of 2019). Nervous at first, she faced her fears on the ropes course at CB camp. Afraid but determined, she pushed through, learning a lesson in persistence she will carry with her.

Guided by her coaches Ashleigh and Bryce, Paige began trusting herself and the CB community.

With the support of her coach, Kade, Paige strengthened her academics and prepared for the ACT. Through virtual tutoring with her CB coach, she boosted her score by a point while also getting help with AP coursework.

That summer, Paige participated in College Bound Summer Institute, earning transferable college credit, sharpening her skills, and getting ready for the next step in her journey.

COLLEGE BOUND SUMMER INSTITUTE (CBSI)

Thanks to the generosity of The Bayer Fund, each summer rising 11th graders can earn transferable college credit on UMSL's campus. CBSI:

- Mitigates summer learning loss and increases reading competency
- Reinforces positive study habits
- Is an opportunity for students to explore being on campus, try a college course, learn how to work with a professor with the support of a coach
- Exposes students to major/career options
- Earns 3 credit hours at no cost (that is a savings of \$1,587 per student)










Paige explores college and applies...

With Risa as her senior-year coach, Paige tackled the college application process head-on. She applied to 12 schools - some local, others across Missouri, and a few out-of-state - ultimately receiving five acceptances and two waitlists. As she considered her options, Paige knew she wanted to go to school on a small campus, closer to home than Mizzou where her sister had gone. Strong academics were also a must.

Along the way, she stepped into a leadership role of her own, representing CB on a virtual Cap & Gown panel and sharing her story with the CB community.




CB ON CAMPUS

Meet Esperance, a STLCC graduate.

After moving from Rwanda to St. Louis at age 11, Esperance graduated high school with honors, but faced setbacks in her first attempt at college. She initially attended college out of state, but without the right guidance or financial resources, she was forced to withdraw. She decided to enroll at St. Louis Community College-Forest Park.

In 2023, Esperance was introduced to CB. Through CB, she found the confidence, motivation, and support to persist. CB helped with transportation, books and supplies, tuition and fees, professional clothing, and a laptop so that she did not have to share with her siblings. With coaches Lucy, Cate, and Britney by her side, she completed a practicum she loved, earned an associate degree in Occupational Therapy in May 2025, and is and is now considering an accelerated master's program to become a licensed occupational therapist.
